GA report eHealth Working group Education Year 2023

During the biennium 2021-2023 the working group continued work on the tasks as stated in the aim in the biennium 2019-2021:

- ✓ Title: Facilitating participation and education incl. patient education.
- ✓ **Aim:** Education content of this workgroup is based on the ACENDIO constitution and on *Position Statements 4+5*.
- ✓ The **product** of this working group is to create a '**Practical Implementation Principles**' on teaching SNLs and eHealth in education (what, how and why).

Seven examples of factsheets resulting from the St Polten workshop in April 2022 and work afterwards (with special thanks to Anne-Berthe van Chastelet for adding the Case project) were used in a workshop session during the Rome conference 2023:

- Frontal teaching: Lecture
- Problem based learning: To PESS
- Case-studies: Guided clinical reasoning
- E-learning methods: Serious gaming
- Transfer tasks: Nursing theories in practice (internship assignment)
- Concept mapping: Case-concept map
- Case project

Attendees were asked to discuss **how the usability and effectiveness of these educational interventions can be evaluated**. At the tables attendees either suggested *outcome criteria, measurement instruments and a methodology or research design*. Also some *adaptations to the examples* were suggested.

The input of nursing professors, researchers, nursing students, and practicing nurses, and especially the discussions between attendees with different backgrounds or from different countries, is considered very valuable.

Since the conference the working group was not able to continue this work and is searching ACENDIO members to collaborate so we can continue the work towards the 15th ACENDIO conference in Rotterdam in 2025.
